## Magical Mountain Getaways

With hiking trails and alpine lakes, our nation's majestic mountain ranges make for great getaways, whether you take the whole family or are seeking a bit of quiet solitude or a romantic retreat. We found mountain resorts and inns from coast to coast offering military discounts.

In Colorado, <u>Aspen Meadows Resort</u> offers <u>30 percent off</u> accommodations through Dec. 31, 2013. The hotel is on the Roaring Forks River, surrounded by the Rocky Mountains, with biking and walking paths that lead to downtown Aspen. <u>Book</u> online, or call (800) 452-4240, and ask for the "Salute to the Heroes" military package.

With its colossal indoor waterpark, kids' programs, and themed restaurants with names like Camp Critter and Loose Moose, <u>Great Wolf Lodge</u> in Pennsylvania's Pocono Mountains might not qualify as a quiet mountain retreat. But it surely is the most family-friendly resort in the area. Military members get 20 percent off accommodations — including free waterpark admission for the entire family. Book online using promo code "HEROES," or call (570) 688-9899. Discount is valid for up to two rooms for larger families.

The Natural Bridge Hotel, adjacent to the Virginia natural wonder once owned by Thomas Jefferson, offers a discounted rate of just \$72.25, Sunday through Thursday, for active duty and retired servicemembers. The rate is \$88.75 on Friday and Saturday. The historic hotel offers Blue Ridge Mountain views, a butterfly garden, nature trails, nearby white-water rafting, and, of course, proximity to the Natural Bridge. Servicemembers also get a 28-percent discount to view the Natural Bridge, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World. Call (800) 533-1410 to learn more.

In the Iron Mountains of Tennessee, servicemembers are invited to stay in a spacious, secluded, pet-friendly, handicap-accessible log cabin called <u>"Creekside Chalet."</u> It's near hiking trails, including

sections of the Appalachian Trail, and close to Watauga Lake for swimming and boating. "It's the perfect romantic getaway for a couple needing time to reconnect. Only the deer and turkey will know you are home," says owner Vikki Woods. The military price is \$600 a week for a couple (regularly priced at \$1,050) or \$1,000 a week for up to six people (regularly \$1,700), plus tax, including all the groceries you'll need to whip up a fabulous country breakfast. Or stay for a long weekend (three nights/four days) for \$300 (regularly priced at \$450). The cabin has three bedrooms, 2.5 bathrooms, a wrap-around deck, a washer and dryer, a hot tub under the stars, and an outdoor grill. Call (423) 768-2446, and ask for the military discount.

The elegant and historic <u>Queensbury Hotel</u> in the Lake George area of upstate New York offers a 15-percent military discount with advance reservations. It's in Glen Falls, just minutes from the Southern Adirondacks, where you can hike or go horseback riding. (Nearby military deals include \$5 discount on horseback riding at <u>Saddle Up Stables</u> and \$5 discount at <u>Adirondack Rafting Co.</u>)
