VICE CHAIRMAN OF THE CALIFORNIA HOTEL & LODGING ASSOCIATION AND CEO OF COAST REDWOOD HOSPITALITY BEN LOMOND, CALIF.

Tell us about your current position.

What is the biggest concern or threat facing the success of the global hotel industry?

I see vacation rentals and home



rentals to be a large threat against the hotel industry. The freedom and amenities that the rentals provide for guests can far exceed what hotels can. The rental division is expanding and growing every year, taking more market share away from hotels. I propose addressing it by adding a division of rentals into hotel companies and benefiting from them.
