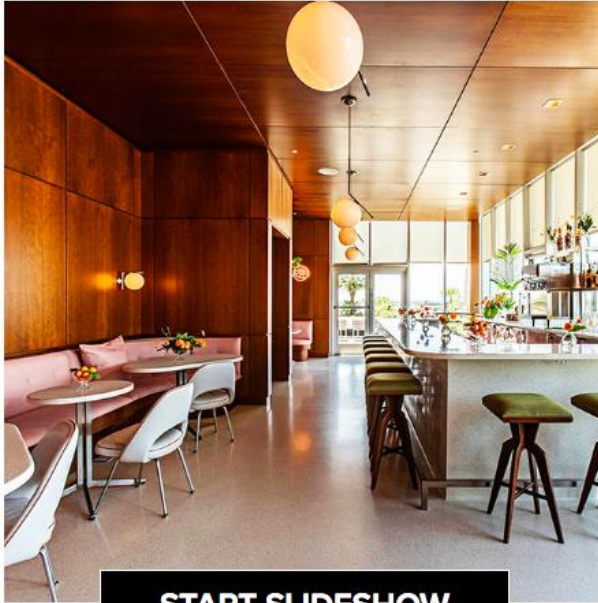


## Our Dream Rooftop Bar Is Perched In Charleston

Well one recently opened up in Charleston that we just might need to hop on a plane to visit. **The Citrus Club** is a cool reservation-only spot on top of **The Dewberry**, the landmark hotel with mid-century charm.

**WORKSTEAD**, the design studio known for its amazing modern light fixtures, was tasked with styling the space. Clearly, they did an incredible job. "Our process was very collaborative for the Citrus Club," shares Robert Highsmith, principal at **WORKSTEAD**. "John Dewberry had a vision to create a rooftop oasis at the top of the hotel, and came to us with a clear program for the space."
