Nashville went from having a dearth of hotels—meaning a downtown Hampton Inn that could charge \$400 a night—to the opposite end of the spectrum: 3,600 new rooms seemingly added all at once. And while the city has become more popular a destination than ever, meaning many of the new hotels still sell out, there is now more to choose from (want guitar lessons in your room? They've got them. Want to stay on the second floor of one of the city's coolest bars? You can do that now). When you think about buildings that need salvation, perhaps the former bank headquarters that now houses The Fairlane wouldn't come to mind first. After all, we don't always think of the 1970s as the height of good design. But thanks to local architect Manuel Zeitlin, the structure lives on as a paragon of mid-century design, one that honors its roots without taking itself too seriously. The lobby's large, floor-to-ceiling windows flood the space with natural light, making it great perch for people-watching. Upstairs, no two rooms are alike.
