

# FULTON LANE INN

## HISTORY

- 1889** A three-story building with an elaborate facade of red brick and sandstone is built for the YWCA. The first floor houses an indoor swimming pool, while the second and third floors' rooms are rented to YWCA members and their guests.
- 1912** On the same street, another three-story building, this one of pressed brick with granite trim and a yellow brick facade- is built for a tailor, John Rugheimer & Sons. Rugheimer started the tailoring business after suffering an injury while blockade running for the confederacy.
- 1992-** After serving as apartments for some time, the buildings undergo a complete renovation. Modern baths and other conveniences are
- 1994** added, while the original historical fixtures are thoughtfully maintained.
- 2008** Finally, all of the buildings are connected by interior hallways, transforming them into a one-of-a-kind destination- the 45-room Fulton Lane Inn.
