

# Historic Homes Guide to Charleston

## FULTON LANE INN'S TOP 5 HISTORIC HOMES IN CHARLESTON



**1** **JOSEPH MANIGAULT HOUSE**  0.7 MILES  
**350 MEETING ST. | CHARLESTONMUSEUM.ORG**

This home is a three-story brick structure built for wealthy rice planters and merchants family during the 18th Century on a raised foundation.

**2** **THE CALHOUN MANSION**  0.7 MILES  
**16 MEETING ST. | CALHOUNMANSION.NET**

Built-in 1879 for George W. William, this is one of the largest historic homes located in Downtown Charleston. This home is 24,000 square foot with 30 mains rooms and a ballroom with a 45-foot high ceiling.

**3** **NATHANIEL RUSSELL HOUSE**  0.5 MILES  
**51 MEETING ST. | HISTORICCHARLESTON.ORG**

Built by wealthy shipping merchant Nathaniel Russell in 1808, this house is known for its free-flying three-story staircase and formal gardens.

**4** **HEYWARD-WASHINGTON HOUSE**  0.5 MILES  
**87 CHURCH ST. | CHARLESTONMUSEUM.ORG**

House of one of the four signers from South Carolina that signed the Declaration of Independence, this property has a collection of historic Charleston-made furniture as well as the public kitchen building dating back to the 1740s.

**5** **AIKEN-RHETT HOUSE**  1.0 MILES  
**48 ELIZABETH ST. | HISTORICCHARLESTON.ORG**

This urban complex is the most preserved antebellum home in Charleston. The house is displayed "as-found" condition including furniture, architectures, and finishes that have not changed since the 19th Century.
