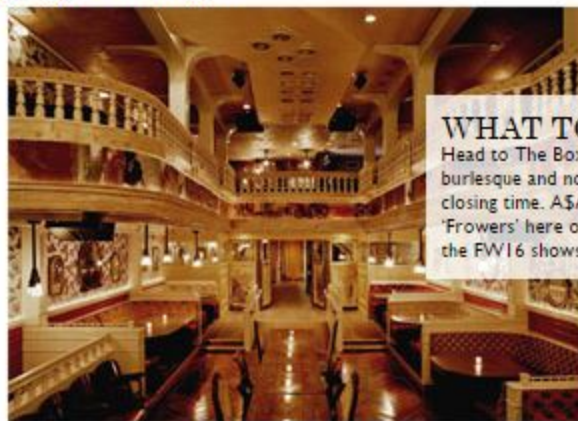
WHERE TO STAY
