





With 19 Pueblos and Navajo (Diné) and Apache Nations, Native American culture is rich in New Mexico. Learn about the history, traditions, and how the path of cultural heritage is preserved and charted for the future.

Breakfast Amaya

Grab a breakfast picnic from Amaya before heading out on your tour of the Picuris Pueblo. You can order your breakfast the prior evening or the morning of with a short wait.

Tour Picuris Pueblo

(Please reserve a week in advance, speak with the concierge)

Take a tour of Picuris Pueblo. A guide will meet you at the pueblo and take you around. The pueblo is nestled in the "hidden valley" of the Sangre de Cristo

Mountains, about one hour north of Santa Fe

Your tour guide will share the history and cultural significance of its location and the Picuris rituals.

For a more scenic drive, take the High Road (NM 503) through Chimayo (NM 98) and Peñasco (NM 76).

Be sure to bring plenty of water, good walking shoes, and layered clothing.





Lunch Tesuque Village Market

On your way back to Santa Fe, stop at Tesuque Village Market, a funky café with an eclectic menu and New Mexican flare. On a cold day, be sure to try the green chile stew.

Visit Institute of American Indian Arts (IAIA) Museum of Contemporary Native Arts

108 Cathedral Pl, Santa Fe, NM 87501

Stop at the IAIA Museum of Contemporary Native Arts (MoCNA) to view some of the country's most progressive work of contemporary Native artists. MoCNA is at the forefront of contemporary Native art presentation and is dedicated solely to advancing the scholarship, discourse, and interpretation of contemporary Native art for regional, national, and international audiences.

Shop the portal at the Palace of the Governors

Head to the Plaza and see the authentic Native American jewelry under the portal at the Palace of the Governors. The portal is reserved for the sale of Native American crafts as a means of preserving the culture of New Mexico's pueblo and tribal cultures.

Shop Shiprock Santa Fe

Stop at Shiprock Santa Fe on your way back to the hotel to see authentic jewelry, textiles, and artwork.

Dinner Amaya

Dine at one of the best restaurants in Santa Fe, right here at the hotel, Amaya, which features modern, seasonal takes on Native American food.
