SKIING DAY

There's nothing like that first hit of cold when you step out of the hotel in your ski jacket and pants. It gets you going for the day. You know you're about to have a great ski day.



Breakfast Café Pasqual's

121 Don Gaspar Ave

Start your day with breakfast at Café Pasqual's. For a New Mexican twist on breakfast, try the Stack of Three Corn Pancakes or the Huevos Barbacoa Con Chile D'Arbol Salsa. If you want to avoid the wait, grab a breakfast burrito to go.

Ski at Ski Santa Fe

It's about a half hour drive (up the hill) to Ski Santa Fe on winding roads. The road is always plowed well, but take your time and enjoy the unbelievable scenery on the way up. Listen to your favorite pre-ski music in your warm car or truck on the way.

At the ski basin, you can park pretty close (if you get there early) and walk right up to the ticket area. After buying your lift ticket (all day or half day), go upstairs for a wonderful coffee





or hot chocolate. Lifts open at 9:00am (9:30am during Daylight Savings Time) but you can sometimes get on early.

The Lower Mountain has some wonderful intermediate runs to get warmed up, after going up the Santa Fe Super Chief (Quad) lift. It's usually sunny (we get 300 days of sun a year in NM) and not windy, but the lower mountain is well protected from wind. The runs Midway and Lower Broadway are for intermediates and Muerte is more advanced.

Then go up top. The Tesuque Peak (triple chair) takes you all the way up. Come down Parachute if you are advanced, or Gayway, if you are intermediate. Enjoy the magnificent view from the top. The advanced North and South Burn runs are ungroomed and end in trees. There's wonderful tree skiing to the skier's left of Gayway if you are up for that. Just take it slow through the trees.

Drinks Totemoff's

Stop at the mid-mountain bar Totemoff's for hot chocolate or something a bit stronger, or a candy bar and warm up.

Soak Ten Thousand Waves

21 Ten Thousand Waves Way

Lifts close at 4:00pm (4:30pm during Daylight Savings Time), so head back down the hill and stop at Ten Thousand Waves, one of the best spas around, inspired by Japanese hot spring spas. Book a private tub in advance or go to the communal tub (bathing suits required) and don't forget the cold plunge. You'll feel great.

Freshen Up Hotel Santa Fe

Swing back by the hotel to drop off your equipment and get ready for a casual dinner.
