
Historic Homes Guide to Charleston

JOHN RUTLEDGE HOUSE INN'S TOP 5 HISTORIC HOMES IN CHARLESTON



JOSEPH MANIGAULT HOUSE 1.0 MILES
350 MEETING ST | CHARLESTONMUSEUM.ORG

This home is a three-story brick structure built for wealthy rice planters and merchants family during the 18th Century on a raised brick foundation.

THE CALHOUN MANSION 10.5 MILES
16 MEETING ST. | CALHOUNMANSION.NET

Built-in 1879 for George W. William is one of the largest historic homes located in Downtown Charleston. With 24,000 square foot with 30 mains rooms and a ballroom with a 45-foot high ceiling.

NATHANIEL RUSSELL HOUSE 10.3 MILES

Built by wealthy shipping merchant Nathaniel Russell in 1808, this house is known for its free-flying three-story staircase and formal gardens.

HEYWARD-WASHINGTON HOUSE 10.3 MILES 87 CHURCH ST. | CHARLESTONMUSEUM.ORG

House of one of the four signers from South Carolina that signed the Declaration of Independence, this property has a collection of historic Charleston-made furniture as well the public kitchen building dating back to 1740's.

AIKEN-RHETT HOUSE \$\int_{1.2}\text{ MILES} \\

This urban complex is the most preserved antebellum home in Charleston. The house is displayed "as-found" condition including furniture, architectures and finishes that have not been altered since the 19th Century.
