- Rates range from about \$349 for a standard king room to \$25,000 a night for each of the two penthouse suites at the five-star Manhattan hotel.
- I recently got a tour of the \$25,000-a-night penthouse suites, the Champagne Suite and the Jewel Suite.
- The suites are commonly booked by diplomats and heads of state, Middle Eastern monarchs and royal family members, and business leaders, according to the hotel's director of sales and marketing.
- Each suite spans three floors, 5,000 square feet, and comes with its own private elevator and landscaped terrace.

The <u>Lotte New York Palace</u>, one of New York City's most iconic luxury hotels, claims to be the oldest operating luxury hotel in the city.

Staying there doesn't come cheap. Nightly rates start at about \$349 and can run up to \$25,000 to stay in one of the hotel's twin penthouse suites.

The <u>Champagne Suite</u> and the <u>Jewel Suite</u> each spans three floors and 5,000 square feet. The two suites are commonly booked by diplomats and heads of state, Middle Eastern monarchs and royal family members, and business leaders, according to David Shenman, the hotel's director of sales and marketing.
