


SEASIDE SERENITY

That "something blue" you need for your wedding day might just lie in **The Grateful Palate** (thegratefulpalate.com), a private event space desirably situated alongside Fort Lauderdale's Intracoastal Waterway. Following an extensive interior renovation by designer Deborah Frustino, the reveal showcases a serene color palette echoing the oceanic hues seen through the venue's floor-to-ceiling windows. Beyond the entryway, where blue herons soar against a marshmallow sky (courtesy of a textural hemp paper by specialty brand Phillip Jeffries), the airy dining room is appointed with floors, doors and decorative stonework evoking pieces of driftwood swept ashore. Billowing ombré curtains, featuring gradient aquatic tones ranging from white-capped waves to murky, deep ocean blues, seem gently washed by the sea. And the ample bar, fabricated in jewel-like blue agate, shimmers like the magnificent, Titanic-size necklace, the "Heart of the Ocean," fictitiously yet famously flung from the deck of the ill-fated ship. —*Robin Hodes*

Now, couples can set the tone early with the right colors and design vibe through a wedding landing page featuring completely custom and original artwork by a Minted designer.
