WENTWORTH MANSION'S TOP 5 HISTORIC CHURCHES IN CHARLESTON



1 SAINT MICHAEL'S CHURCH 0.8 MILES

71 BROAD ST. | STMICHAELSCHURCH.NET

This one of the most iconic churches in Charleston first erected in the 1680s. One of the most remarkable features of this church is the 186 height white steeple, and their notable parishioners include George Washington and Robert E. Lee.

2 CIRCULAR CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH 0.7 MILES

This church contains the oldest burial grounds with monuments dating back to 1695. The Sanctuary and the Lance Hall are registered on the National Historic Landmark.

3 UNITARIAN CHURCH 0.4 MILES

4 ARCHDALE ST. | CHARLESTONUU.ORG

This English perpendicular Gothic revival style church is the second oldest church in downtown Charleston erected in 1776.

4 FRENCH HUGUENOT CHURCH 0.8 MILES

136 CHURCH ST. | HUGUENOT-CHURCH.ORG

Located in the heart of the French Quarter, this is the only remaining independent Huguenot Church in America.

5 CATHEDRAL OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST 0.6 MILES

120 BROAD ST. | CHARLESTONCATHEDRAL.COM

Known as the mother church of the Catholic Diocese of Charleston, this church is noted by their Franz Mayer & Co. stained glass and hand-painted stations of the cross.
