When Conrad Hilton purchased his first hotel in Cisco, Texas, in 1919, he simply envisioned a space for laborers to rest their heads after long shifts at the oil refinery. In the 100 years since that groundbreaking business decision, the Hilton company has opened its doors to hard workers, vacationing families and everyone in between across 17 brands and 5,700-plus properties around the globe.

When Chris Nassetta took over as Hilton's CEO in 2007, one of his initial missions was to strengthen the presence of his higher-end hotels. Since that strategy was announced, the company's most sophisticated labels — [Waldorf Astoria Hotels & Resorts](#), [Conrad Hotels & Resorts](#) and the new, boutique-minded [LXR Hotels & Resorts](#) — steadily have grown.
